








Harry's Run

This year's Harry's Run was to a repeat of where we went in 2012, namely to the Tyabb Packing House Antiques Centre. Tyabb is on the Mornington Peninsula and chiefly known for the Antiques Centre and also the Old Aeroplane (Restoration) Company beside the grass airfield.

We used a familiar leaving point of the car park for the Brandon Park Shopping Centre and a suitable place for the various Fiat models, all post WWII. Safety on the one hour drive to Tyabb was underlined by the following cartoon at the heading of the route instructions.

It must have worked as there were no reports of traffic infringements by our members. The drive had us on the Dandenong Bypass Road and onto the Western Port Highway. The road is straight and after leaving the commercial areas we travelled open flat land which eventually will relieve the housing shortage. After a couple of turns and 28 km we arrived beside the railway line at the Tyabb Packing House Antiques Centre.

The Centre is quite large and hosts a number of stalls which are operated by individuals. It also has an internal restaurant but also towards the rear a converted Red Rattler railway carriage set up for coffee and cakes.

The range of items available cover a very wide range from conventional antiques to more modern items such as movie memorabilia.



The intended leaving time of midday was written in the route instructions which saved rounding up those with keen eyes for the unusual or bargain for the knowledgeable. Twenty minutes later we were at the Dava Hotel in Mt Martha and joined by Jenny Baker. The Dava Hotel kindly set up a separate area for the 40 odd club attendees. The adequate menu proved popular and the availability of seniors meals on a Sunday was appreciated by some members. Conversation over the three long tables was very consistent from a very cheerful members.

Later at the General Meeting, the Harry Baker Clubman Award was presented to Bruno and Fiona Tunisso to recognise their involvement in the club's Social Activities.

RAA BAY to BIRDUOOD


The RAA Bay to Birdwood is an annual historic motoring event in Adelaide & the Adelaide Hills, South Australia. It is a 67km run of over 1500 privately owned vehicles from West Beach, Adelaide to the National Motor Museum in Birdwood in the Adelaide Hills.

The inaugural Bay to Birdwood was held in 1980. It is now one of the largest historical motoring celebrations of its type globally and includes vehicles dating back to the early 1900s. It is open to all vehicles 30 years and older.


While not an event on our club calendar, Rob & I in the Fiat Dino Coupe, Roger Beattie in his 850 Campervan and new member, Peter Galtry with his 124 Spider ventured across to Adelaide for this year's event.

The weather was fantastic, the array of participating vehicles was amazing and the organization very impressive! From vintage Rolls Royces to the vintage











farm truck (dog and all!) through to our more modern cars; Concours condition cars right down to many daily drivers. Everyone enjoying getting their cars out.

The run to Birdwood took nearly two and a half hours as part of a cavalcade of 1500+ cars. (By comparison the run back into Adelaide free of the traffic took 50 minutes. Rob & the Dino reveled in the roads and the beautiful handling of the car).

Spectators lined the route cheering and waving the cars along. Most set up for the day with chairs, drinks, snacks and even lunch picnics. It felt a bit like we were in the Mille Miglia in Italy!

Participants are encouraged to dress in the era of their vehicle and the Fashions on the Field competition has become a major component of the RAA Bay to Birdwood Finish festival. AUSTRALIAN LANCIA REGISTER CASTLEMAINE RALLY

Several FCCV members attended the ALR Castlemaine Rally display day at the Western Oval in Castlemaine on Sunday 19 October. The weather was warm and a little windy and the variety and quality of cars on display was certainly impressive.

This year the event celebrated the 70th anniversary of Professor Antonio Fessia joining Lancia.

Fessia was born in Turin in 1901 and graduated as a mechanical engineer in 1923.

He joined Fiat in 1925 and progressed rapidly throughout the company, holding Technical Director positions in both the Vehicle and Aircraft Divisions.

Some of the Fiats that we are familiar with, and that were developed under his leadership, include the Balilla, the Fiat 500 Topolino, and the early 1100. He left Fiat in 1946 and joined CEMSA of Saronno, part of the Caproni group and worked as a consultant with Ducati Bologna, Pirelli and NSU-Fiat between 1950 and 1955.











In 1955 he joined Lancia, first as a consultant, and then as Technical Central Director. His technical influence can be seen in the design of the Appia, Flaminia, Flavia and the Fulvia. He died in 1968.

As usual, the ALR conducted a wonderful display with a good number

Fessia influenced cars were on display. And, of course, there was an incredible collection of Lambda and later model Lancias to admire and inspect. Our group of Fiats presented nicely too and received a lot of interest from the spectators.

Vintage Fiat Starter Motor Advice

Here is a tip to ensure the Bendix gear returns to the back stop on most Fiat starter motors, pre 1928. Note the strip of spring steel that is meant to press down on the steel ball that holds the gear back by inserting into the shallow groves along the smooth section of the gear identified by the screwdriver in the second photo. The steel strip can be rendered ineffective by the lack of pressure on the ball

Carefully lever up the locating end that dips into the aluminium body and swivel it around, Then carefully increase the bend in the strip so it makes improved contact with the steel ball. Then relocate the strip back to the original position.

Mid-Week Archibald Prize Run to Geelong

Elsa and Richard Unkles have been particularly busy organising events for members. On Wednesday 15th October 12 members met at the Geelong Gallery to see the Archibald Prize Finalists Exhibition. It was a sunny & pleasant day for a drive to Geelong. We met for 10.20am entry to the exhibition and spent nearly two hours enjoying the wonderful selection of 57 finalists artworks, then voting in the "People's Choice" award. Even selecting 57 of the 903 entries to the Archibald must be a daunting task for the judges, let alone selecting the Winner.

The 2025 winner was by Julie Fragar, for Flagship Mother Multiverse (Justene) – a portrait of Justene Williams. a Brisbane artist.

To be considered for the Archibald Prize, an artwork must be a portrait painting from life, no larger than 90,000 sq cm with a maximum height of 3m, and painted by an artist resident in Australasia. The

subject should ideally be a distinguished Australian in art, letters, science, or politics, though this is not a strict requirement. The artist must have had at least one live sitting with the subject.

This cannot possibly do the artworks justice. I would recommend a trip to Geelong by the 9th November if you are reading this in time. Otherwise look out for the Archibald in 2026.


